Speaker Highlights

Robert Cicco, MD is the Associate Director of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at The Western Pennsylvania Hospital in Pittsburgh, PA. In addition to his private neonatology practice, he practiced general pediatrics for a number of years and continues an active involvement in the Neonatal Follow Up Program at West Penn Hospital. His experience in primary care pediatrics has given him a greater appreciation of the important role of the family both inside and outside of the NICU.

Lynn Wolf, MOT, OTR, IBCLC practices occupational therapy at Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Center in Seattle, WA, and is an Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of Washington. Her clinical specialty is the treatment of infants, with a strong focus on feeding issues. She is NDT trained and a Board Certified Lactation Consultant, with extensive national and international experience speaking about infant feeding.

Susan M. Ludington, RN, CNM, Ph.D., FAAN is a Professor and Walters Chair of Pediatric Nursing, Bolton School of Nursing, Case Western Reserve University. She has been in the field of nursing since 1972 and is a certified nurse midwife. She has worked on federally funded research in the neonatal intensive care unit since 1988. She is the first NIH funded researcher in America to study Kangaroo Care, is a founding member of the International Network for Kangaroo Mother Care and is President of the U.S.A. Division of the International Network of Kangaroo Mother Care.

Terry S. Johnson, RNC, ARNP, MN is the founder of Lode Star Enterprises, Inc. a profession practice service and maintains a clinical practice as a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner. Terry's clinical experience includes the NICU, Special Care and Normal Newborn Nursery, as well as Developmental Follow-up Services. A nationally known speaker, Terry is currently a fellow in the Patient Safety Leadership Fellowship Program through the Health Research and Educational Trust and the American Hospital Association. She was the 2006 recipient of the National Association of Neonatal Nurses SIG (Special Interest Group) Leadership Award.
