<i>ISDH Update; Judy Ganser, MD and Beth Johnson</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children's Social, Emotional, and Behavioral Health task force, ages 0-22, last week had special meetings about early childhood/maternal mental health</li> <li>• Indiana ranks #1 in child abuse deaths (July 2004-2005); #1 in unintentional infant deaths due to suffocation; infant death task force to look at this problem - preventable deaths (SIDS/rollover/layover)</li> <li>• ISDH surveying nursery staff - studies show workers may not agree or follow guidelines or give parents correct info</li> <li>• AAP coming out with no swaddling guidelines; need to praise hospitals</li> </ul>

	<p>that are getting the right message out (keep babies out of adult beds)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Smoking increased (24.8%-27.3%) in Indiana in general population and more Hoosiers are considered obese (25.5%-27.2%) from 2004 to 2005</li> <li>• Indiana Quitline will focus on pregnant women—they can receive 3 sessions with a certified therapist; Quitline info has been mailed to OB's, and Family Physicians; use ITCP committees in each county to work with MD practices/clinics; online certification for smoking cessation counseling available</li> <li>• Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Committee having community dialogues starting in June to respond to a statewide strategic plan; goal is to have programs in each county</li> </ul>
<p><i>Maple City Health Care Center; Beth Elmore, CNM</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Centering pregnancy groups; neighborhood based center in Goshen, Indiana; 1/3 of patients are Hispanic immigrants; 167 babies delivered last year</li> <li>• Goal is to provide comprehensive, excellent health care that is culturally sensitive and easily accessible; most staff speak Spanish (bilingual or in area of care); most patients are under or uninsured; most kids are on Medicaid; 75% fees from service, 10% grants, 15% donations; lab contract for discounts, dispense generic drugs;</li> <li>• Care should be based on relationships (patient, workplace, community); evidence based care; moved toward model where administrative team has direct patient contact</li> <li>• Provide doula service, many are bilingual; doulas are paid by health care center, \$200 per delivery; meets patient at end of pregnancy, stays through labor, at least 1 visit postpartum</li> <li>• Centering model changes all aspects of care; even board meets in the centering model</li> <li>• 3 prongs of centering pregnancy are risk assessment, education and support; current emphasis of prenatal care is on risk assessment, but most women are relatively healthy and need education and support</li> <li>• Centering makes education/social support central and occurring together; risk assessment is necessary but not so much a focus; start at 12-18 weeks and continue for 10 sessions throughout pregnancy with same group; first 3-4 sessions focus on prenatal care, middle sessions on labor and delivery, final 3-4 on postpartum mother/baby care</li> <li>• Funded 2 years by March of Dimes, adding more postpartum sessions this year (bf and ppd support, well baby care)</li> <li>• Eng/Spanish conducted together; co-facilitation w/doctor, perinatal care</li> </ul>

<p><i>Medicaid Changes/MCO RFS; Laurie Weinzapfel</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Medicaid published an RFS and managed care companies are currently responding; state is divided into 8 regions w/2-3 MCO's in each; behavioral health care will be part of health plans (substance abuse, chemical dependency); focus on safety net providers; pay for performance and provider incentives; members select health plan; PMP's can contract with multiple plans; MCO's must include plans for data sharing, school-based health care, personal accountability</li> <li>• Julie St. Clair, Evansville: Concerns about pregnancy Medicaid system; What will evolve with new system? No longer have a local case worker for enrollments? Will there be a public comment period?</li> <li>• Judy Ganser explained some of application process (online or printed out); still have option to enroll w/o using a computer; encouraged people to express their concerns to legislators</li> </ul>
